2023 Strasburg Community Tree Lighting, a New Twist on a Historic Holiday Tradition

Many of us who have grown up in or near Strasburg have fond memories of Christmas on the Square. It is a tradition that has taken place for more years than most of us are probably aware (see below picture from 1940!). While the specifics of the event have changed throughout the years, the purpose has not. This event has been and will continue to be an event to celebrate the holiday season with our family, friends, and community.

This year's event will feature the lighting of a newly-planted and decorated 12' Frasier fir tree centered in the front lawn of the Strasburg Borough Municipal Building at 145 Precision Avenue. The location may be different, but this festive tree lighting will include some of the same traditions as in the past. Santa Claus will still be arriving on the fire truck, there will be caroling, and of course, hot cocoa & cookies. With the additional room at this location, the event can expand to include new additions such as a food truck for those who would like to purchase dinner and kids' activity stations.

The festivities will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, December 1st, with the tree lighting anticipated at 7 p.m. There will be time afterwards to enjoy the activities as well as visit the Lancaster County Art Association and Strasburg-Heisler Library. We hope to see you there!



Strasburg Community Hometown Hero Program

Strasburg Borough is proud to offer the community an opportunity to honor a past or present Strasburg-area member of the Armed Forces with a Hometown Hero street banner.

Banners will be 24" x 48" and include a picture of the service member, name, rank, and branch of service. Banners will be hung for 2 seasons (a season is May-October) and then retired and returned to the sponsor. The cost to sponsor a banner is \$250. This cost helps cover the manufacturing of the banner and mounting kit. Any excess funds will be reserved in our civic celebrations

account to support community activities. No taxpayer dollars will fund the banners.

HONORING

Space is limited to roughly 40 banners per round, this program operates on a firstcome, first-served basis. In order to accommodate the most families, the Borough

reserves the right to limit the number of applications per family, per round. Applications received that cannot be accommodated in the current round will be kept and placed on a waiting list for the next available round. Do I Need a Permit?

The best answer to this question is to call the Borough Office, explain your project, and a Borough representative will answer your questions.

Ordinance Reminders

Residents are reminded of these Borough Ordinances that are enforced by the Police Department. Questions regarding these ordinances should be directed to the Police Department by calling 717-687-7128 (complete copies of these ordinances are available on the Borough's website at https://ecode360.com/ST2465)

Snow Shoveling/Blowing - You have 24 hours after snowfall stops to remove snow and ice from your sidewalks, clearing a path at least 30 inches wide. *It is prohibited to blow/shovel snow into the travel lane of any roadway. If you're cited for violating the ordinance, the fine is \$300.

Control and Maintenance of Animals (Dog Barking) - Dogs barking for more than 10 minutes continuously or 30 minutes intermittently are considered to be in violation. The complainant cannot, by Ordinance, be anonymous and an officer must witness the dog barking. The Ordinance requires a written notice/warning of the violation before prosecution may commence. Violations of this Ordinance are punishable by a fine up to \$600.

Street Storage & Dumpsters - Any street storage or dumpster placement on the street requires a permit. Examples of street storage include trailers not connected to a vehicle and mulch piles. Violations of this Ordinance are punishable by a fine up to \$600.



Borough Notifications (Emergency & Non-Emergency)

Our previous notification system, Swift911TM, is no longer in use and your information has been transferred to our new system, Rave Mobile Safety. Please call or stop by the Borough Office to add/remove your phone number or e-mail address from our notification list. Examples of notifications you will receive are street sweeping, water flushing, and water/snow emergency notices. This system is used to get information to as many of our residents as possible, and as quickly as possible.

Holiday Shopping Tips

The holiday shopping season will soon be upon us. It can be fun, but it can also be stressful, strenuous, and even dangerous. Whether you are shopping in-person or from the comfort of your home, take some time to review these tips to keep you and your newly purchased gifts safe.

- Avoid carrying cash. You may want to limit your credit card spending—however, if you lose your credit card, it can be replaced. Cash cannot.
- Use credit cards instead of debit cards. Security protections are different.
- Don't carry more weight than you can handle.
- If shopping in-person, try to take a shopping buddy along who can help you carry your purchases, and stay alert of your surroundings and any suspicious characters.
- When entering the parking lot, scan the area for anyone loitering, even during daylight hours.
- If shopping alone and you decide to drop purchases off at your car before continuing to shop, scan the area for anyone watching you put your purchases in your vehicle before going back into the store. If someone nearby seems suspicious, move your vehicle to a different parking lot to avoid a potential break-in and theft.
- If you feel like you're being watched or followed, immediately go back into the store or shopping center and look for a security guard. Request an escort to your vehicle.
- Have your car keys ready in your hand to avoid fumbling for them at your vehicle.
- Pay attention to vehicles parked directly next to yours. Is anyone in the vehicle? Is that person next to the driver's side of your vehicle? If you feel uncomfortable, go back inside and request an escort to your vehicle. Trust your instincts.



- If shopping online, be sure the website you're on is secured by looking for the lock symbol to the left of the URL.
- Avoid online purchases that are "too good to be true"—they usually are. Do some research on the vendor before committing to a purchase.



Memorial Tree Plaques

Strasburg Borough recently installed brass memorial plaques for dedicated trees that line the Borough front lawn. The trees were planted in remembrance of Diana Hallman, Mike Sollenberger, Donald Bachman, and Harold Wiker, who passed while serving the Borough.

A plaque was also placed to identify the Honey Locust Gettysburg Witness-Tree descendant that was donated by Shull's Tree Service.

Strasburg Borough Authority's East Main & South Decatur Street watermain replacement project is underway. There will be no road closures, but there may be minor traffic interruptions.





Strasburg Borough Authority is responsible for the water and sanitary sewer system, and now also stormwater. In the coming months they will begin tackling the Borough's stormwater issues that have been many years in the making. There are large projects that will be done in phases, and there are smaller projects that will be done by our Public Works Department. We are excited to start the stormwater journey and hope to ease Borough flooding issues.

Shoveling/Snow Blowing Tip:

To avoid shoveling/snow blowing your driveway more than once after a storm, follow these tips:

- Wait until after your street has been plowed to shovel the end of your driveway closest to the street.
- When clearing the entrance to your driveway, shovel snow into a pile to the right of the driveway when facing the street and create a small, clear pocket to the left of the driveway for crews to leave snow during plowing.

If a snow emergency is declared, all vehicles must be removed from **snow emergency routes until the emergency is lifted.** Streets signs are posted on those roads designated as snow emergency routes. When a snow emergency is declared, it is done with your safety in mind. In order to make sure emergency vehicles can reach people in need, the snow emergency routes must be cleared of parked cars, and vehicles on the roadways need snow tires or chains.
