Garage & Yard Sales


Summer is here, and so are garage/yard sales. While garage/yard sales are permitted there are some rules:



- 1. No garage/yard sale shall be conducted for a period longer than two consecutive days, and only two garage/yard sales are permitted per property each year.
- 2. Garage/yard sales may offer personal possessions for sale; no import or stocking of inventory is permitted.
- 3. No garage/yard sale is permitted to be conducted within the street right-of-way.

Old medications cluttering your cabinets? The Strasburg Borough Police Department is a permanent drop off location to help residents dispose of expired or unwanted medications, in a safe and secure manner.

Please empty contents of unwanted medication bottles into <u>unmarked Ziplock-style baggies</u> with no personal information on them. Borough Notifications (Emergency & Non-Emergency)

Our previous notification system, Swift911TM, is no longer in use and your information has been transferred to our new system, Rave Mobile Safety. Please call or stop by the Borough Office to add/remove your phone number or e-mail address from our notification list. Examples of notifications you will receive are street sweeping, water flushing, and water/snow emergency notices. This system is used to get our information to as many of our residents as possible, and as quickly as possible.

Bike Safety Tips

Children will be riding bikes more often once school is out. For their safety and those around them, please review some basic bike safety tips to avoid any unnecessary injuries.

- Always wear a helmet when riding a bike (or anything with wheels).
- Wear bright colors or reflective clothing to make sure you are seen.
- Ride in the direction of traffic.
- Obey traffic laws Stop at all stop signs and stop lights (until green).
- Don't call or text while riding and keep at least one ear free from headphones.
- If you have to ride at night, make sure you have a headlight and taillight.
- Yield to pedestrians, they have the right-of-way.
- Watch out for potholes, glass, and gravel.

Do I Need a Permit?

The best answer to this question is to call the Borough Office, explain your project, and a Borough representative will answer your questions.

Ordinance Reminders

Residents are reminded of the following Borough Ordinances which are enforced by the Police Department. Questions regarding these ordinances should be directed to the Police Department by calling 717-687-7128 (complete copies of these ordinances are available on the Borough's website at https://ecode360.com/ST2465)



Grass & Weeds - Grass and weeds are not permitted to exceed six (6) inches in height, bushes should not block sidewalks, and you should not blow grass into the street. If you need assistance with your yard, consider reaching out to a neighbor or one of the many lawn care companies in the area.



Street Storage & Dumpsters - Any street storage or dumpster placement on the street requires a permit. Examples of street storage include trailers not connected to a vehicle, and mulch piles.



Burning - Outdoor burning, including all types of waste, trash, and rubbish, is prohibited in Strasburg Borough, with limited exception. Cooking of food on a grill or food smoker is allowed; for other burning, check with the Police Department to see if a permit is needed.



Control and Maintenance of Animals (Dog Barking) - Dogs barking for more than 10 minutes continuously or 30 minutes intermittently are considered to be in violation. The complainant cannot, by Ordinance, be anonymous and an officer must witness the dog barking. The Ordinance requires a written notice/warning of the violation before prosecution may commence. Violations of this Ordinance are punishable by a fine up to \$600.



Fireworks - Despite recent changes in Pennsylvania law, very few fireworks are Strasburg-legal. As a general rule, any firework display that leaves the ground needs to be licensed or is considered to be illegal. Please see the Borough website for our full Ordinance.



Curfew - Parents are reminded that persons under the age of 18 are restricted by a curfew Sunday through Thursday 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. and Friday and Saturday from midnight to 5:00 a.m. During these hours, juveniles must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. The ordinance makes the *parent* responsible for this misconduct.




Eshelman Run Streambank Stabilization MS4 Project

The Eshelman Run Streambank Stabilization MS4
Project was completed in November 2022. This
project restored approximately 417 linear feet of
streambank, reduced the sediment load, and created a
native riparian buffer.



Strasburg Borough is in the planning stages of future stormwater/MS4 projects to address our municipality's stormwater infrastructure. Our historic town was incorporated in 1733, many years before there were any stormwater regulations, leaving our town with numerous "problem" areas. We are currently in the process of organizing a Stormwater Authority to pursue and manage these much needed projects.

The water that flows into storm drains is not treated or filtered for pollutants. This untreated water eventually flows into our streams, rivers, bays and eventually to the ocean. Help keep pollutants such as oil, soap, chemicals, dirt, grass clippings and other debris from clogging and polluting our waterways.

Think that little drip can't be costing you much... THINK AGAIN!



Drips and leaks can add up fast when it comes to your quarterly water/sewer bill!

Avoid unnecessary usage and high bills by taking a few minutes to inspect your homes faucets, pipes, hoses, & toilets for leaks. This <u>drip calculator</u> can show you how much water your tiny leak may really be adding up to.



Swimming Pool Reminders



All pools (including spas, hot tubs, and "bladder" or storable pools which are available at local department

stores) which have a filtration system require zoning approval and a building permit/inspections. These permits/inspections are to your benefit as a property owner to insure the safety of anyone on your property. If you have any questions about your project, please contact the Borough Office.

Any time you are going to dig, you should call the Pennsylvania One-Call System to make sure there are no underground utilities where you are going to be working. If you do not call and you damage a line, the underground utilities can impose a fine.
